*Interwoven* loans to NEVADA STATE MUSEUM:

The Nevada State Museum abides by the guidelines of the American Association of Museums for the care and exhibition of works of art. The museum provides loaned objects a level of care and security equal to or greater than the level given to museum collections.

The museum will provide protection against fire, theft, mishandling, dirt, pest damage and environmental extremes. The museum will not be responsible for gradual inherent deterioration. Evidence of new damage will be reported immediately to the Lender. No alteration, restoration or repair will be undertaken without the Lender's prior permission.

The Lender agrees that objects are in such condition as to withstand the strains of packing, transportation and necessary handling.

As an agency of the State of Nevada, the museum falls under the state's self-insured program covering liability or loss as authorized under NRS 41.031 and the State Administrator's manual chapter 0500. Objects on loan to the museum are covered under the state's self-insured program.

The Lender gives permission to the Nevada State Museum to photograph objects on loan and to use those photographs for education and promotion of this exhibit. The Nevada State Museum will not sell these images or use them for any other purpose without the Lender's permission. Objects on exhibit may be photographed by the general public.

Objects loaned to the Nevada State Museum specifically for inclusion in an exhibition shall remain in the possession of the museum through the end of the exhibit.
